- We provide the state (by people working and paying taxes) with a lot more tax money.
- We provide the state with more upstanding citizens who don't have to steal to live, but who add to the economy.
- We provide peace for all residents so they can develop mentally and spiritually.
- We provide actual jobs for about 10% of the residents.
- We provide (through program fees and donations) money to add more bed space for new clients.
- We provide prayer warriors for all requests.
- We provide a clean and sober living environment with random drug testing every week.
- We have a NO TOLERANCE policy dirty UA's.
- We have a committee for review of unsolved issues and complaints.
- We are the second largest mental facility Oklahoma. The Department of Corrections is

number one.

- We have ongoing professional training for staff, and we are continually improving in every area.
- We provide maintenance for all rooms.

Most importantly, we do it with program fees of \$105 to \$140 per week.

My early childhood was rough. My parents weren't Christians, and they were both addicted to crack. I was in a terrible position, and my life was less than pleasurable. I had many emotional and behavioral issues. I was a hurt child, and I began acting out. I spent more time in hospitals than is healthy for a child.

My mother decided to clean up her life. She went to rehab, and she has been great since that time. She married a good man who has been a great influence on my life. I was given a firm foundation of morals and Christian beliefs, but it took more than half of my life to realize these things. I see our magnificent, loving God's hand in everything I have been through.

Because of my childhood, I continued down the wrong path through my teen years. I was on my way to prison when I was 17. This was the first time I went to prison, and I was incarcerated for seven and a half years. It

took going to prison a second time for me to take hold of who Christ says I am and who He wants me to be. This is a lifelong process, but I can say I am not who I used to be.

When I was preparing to be released from prison the second time, I assumed I would be homeless, but my case manager told me about Hand Up Ministries. Hand Up has been a Godsend. Not only do I have a bed and a roof over my head, but I am surrounded by likeminded men. I am truly blessed by this opportunity. I am thankful to God, and I am grateful to David Nichols for having the vision and drive to create Hand Up.

I am fighting to incline my heart to God's will, and I love being part of His army. God has blessed me beyond measure. I wish the best for you in Christ.

I was born in El Paso, Texas in 1983. I have two sisters and one brother. I grew up attending the Catholic Church. I started using drugs when I was 13, and I quit going to church. I ran track in middle school and high school (1600 meter relay). I was convicted of a felony when I was 16, and I had to quit school.

I lived in Juarez for ten years, and I continued to use drugs. I got married in El Paso 2004, and we had two children. I worked in construction and roofing. We got divorced in 2013, and I remarried in 2015. I had another child with my second wife. I came to Oklahoma in 2015 to live with my aunt. My wife stayed in El Paso. I was arrested in 2015, and I started going to church in prison. I was released in May, 2020.

I learned about Hand Up Ministries 90 days before I discharged from prison. My case manager told me to fill out the

application for Hand Up. I came to Hand Up on May 20th, 2020. God has done many good things for me. When I was 27, I had kidney failure, and I was on dialysis for 18 months. I prayed, and God healed me. Hand Up has given me a home and an opportunity to live a better life. I am waiting for the new things that will come.

I was born and raised in the church, but my life changed after I graduated from high school and went off to college. I started to party and have fun. God was no longer part of my life. Drugs, alcohol, and sex were the center of my life. Later in life, I professed to be a Christian, but I would go to church on Sunday and return to my old ways during the rest of the week.

I did some things which hurt other people, and I am truly ashamed of these things. My actions resulted in two failed marriages. It all came to a halt in 2002. I was arrested, and I spent 15 years in prison. I knew I had to reevaluate my life. Prison gave me time to find out who God truly was. I confessed my sins to Him, and I asked Him to change my heart and come into my life. My life changed that day, and I knew in my heart that God's grace was the only way I could truly change.

When I was released, I didn't know what I would do or where I would stay. A friend told me about Hand Up ministries, so I applied to Hand Up. I was accepted, and I knew God had my back, just as He had promised. I knew I had to continue to be faithful and obey and trust God. I found a wonderful, Bible believing church which helped me through the transition by helping me with both my physical and spiritual needs. This church has helped me know the Lord and who He truly is.

I have had so many wonderful blessings since I was released from prison. The most important blessing is the blood of Christ, for which I am very thankful. Without Christ's blood, I wouldn't have a second chance. I am truly happy and blessed more now than at any other time in my life. I still remember what my mom told me. She said to pray and hold onto God's unchanging hand.
